NOTE FROM THE HEADMASTER

The last few weeks of term have flown by and it seems like only yesterday that our students returned from their mid-term break. Our S4-S6 students have been busily preparing for their exams and completing their assignments. It is absolutely essential that ALL examination students use their Easter holidays to get some effective and meaningful revision done. Our Easter holidays are currently too long – we need the students back earlier in order to help them prepare for their exams. Obviously, I can't do anything about the 2018 and 2019 dates, which have already been published, but from 2020 onwards, we are reducing our Easter holiday to two weeks, which will effectively be the first two weeks of April. As a result of this, Grand Day will be taking place on the 2nd last Friday of June from 2020 onwards – but no changes to 2018 or 2019 dates will be made.

Back to revision for S4-S6 students – some students struggle to create a revision timetable – the easiest way to do this is simply to revise following their school timetable. When they normally have Maths, study Maths. When they have English, study for English. This leaves plenty of time for breaks and all evenings would be free for relaxation and socialising.

Last term saw a high number of admissions candidates braving the new process to try and gain a place at QVS. We had seventy applicants in total and were able to offer around fifty places this year. We can't wait to welcome our new intake in August and see them blossom into the next batch of Victorians but we are sorry we couldn't offer everyone a place and we know there will be some disappointed families out there.

Looking forward to the summer term, we have a parade on May 6th, followed by a PLG meeting. The new timetable for 18/19 starts on June 11th and of course, Grand Day itself is on June 29th.

We hope to see as many of you as possible at our May parade and on Grand Day.

I hope everyone has a great term and best of luck to all those taking SQA exams.

GRAND DAY ARRANGEMENTS

All parents are invited to attend the Prize-giving Ceremony in the morning as well as the Parade in the afternoon. We would like to remind parents that the whole school is expected to attend the Prize-giving and NO pupil should be outside the marquee after 9.50am. Everyone must be seated by 10am. If you are not attending Prize-giving, please avoid the area around the Marquee while the Prize-giving is in progress. Thank you.

The format for Grand Day is as follows:

9.50am - Parents, guests and the whole School seated

10.00am - Prize-giving

2.00pm - Parade

Time may be fairly tight and it is regretted that we do not have catering facilities for lunch for everyone. However, if you would like to bring a picnic, you are welcome to use the School grounds. In addition, the School caterers will be providing a cafeteria service in the CCF building where snacks can be purchased from 11am onwards.

Parents unable to come to the Prize-giving may wish to attend the Parade along with relatives/friends. Those attending are asked to be seated prior to the Parade.

We should like to remind everyone that any pupil found to be out of their Houses during the night/early morning before Grand Day will not be allowed to take part in the Grand Day Parade. We very much hope, however, that lessons have been learned by the necessity to invoke such sanctions in previous years.

NB: YOUR SON/DAUGHTER MUST SIGN OUT IN THE HOUSE BEFORE LEAVING IN ORDER TO SATISFY ALL SCHOOL PROCEDURES INCLUDING FIRE REGULATIONS. PUPILS IN YEAR GROUPS P7-S3 INCLUSIVE SHOULD BE COLLECTED FROM AND RETURNED TO HOUSES BY PARENTS / CARERS.

HAIR CUTS & COLOURS

Generally our pupils are reasonable and understand that the Ceremonial aspects of QVS life demand a conventional hairstyle and hair colour. Occasionally, however, we find that pupils return to School after a holiday with an unnatural hair colour or without having their hair cut. We would ask that you support and encourage your sons and daughters to respect the requirements, and ensure that they have an acceptable haircut before returning to School. Hair must be worn off the collar when in Ceremonial uniform. Thank you for your support in this.



SUMMER HOLIDAY ARRANGEMENTS

Pupils who are staying at School overnight on 29 June should make arrangements to travel no later than Saturday 30 June.
