Note from the Head

Happy New Year to you all. I hope the festive break has been a good one and that the children are all ready for the new term and the new year ahead.

We live in uncertain times just now and have done for the past 2 years. However, one thing is absolutely certain – that when your child comes to QVS, we will do our absolute best to ensure that their education continues to the same high standards you are used to and that our pastoral care systems continue to be sector-leading.

In terms of education, we have the S4-S6 prelims during the next half-term, even though we don't know yet whether we are going to have any traditional exams or not at the end of the academic year. However, no matter what system is in place in May, students always needs evidence to prove their work is at a certain level and so the prelims go ahead as normal. We also have course choice coming up for all year groups from S2 to S5. Course choice is very important and each student, along with their families, should decide whether to specialise, with a particular career/next step in mind, or whether to study a broad range of subjects which leaves the door open to many pathways in the future. The good news is that our systems are so flexible that even if a student decides to go down a specific pathway in S4, there is scope to change that pathway entirely in S5 or S6.

In terms of boarding life and our pastoral care systems, we really do everything we can to get the right level of support in place for every individual child. That might mean no support is required – just a watching brief – or it might mean a student is on a detailed care plan to ensure they are feel safe and secure in this environment. We encourage students to do activities which look after both their physical wellbeing and their mental wellbeing. Mental Health is our biggest challenge – as any school would tell you nowadays – and this is where we need to work together with parents to find a model of home/school support which works for the young person involved.

So, we move into 2022 ready to build on the successes of previous years, determined to improve further in every aspect of school life. The desire for continuous improvement is second nature for the team here and, alongside the supportive community we have, we can make sure we have a great year ahead.
